## Writing the Poem (continued)

**Final stage:** I will be very useful to experiment with different fonts, type sizes and typographical or other digital design features when producing your final version.

It might also be useful to literally cut and paste your concrete poems. This means that you can cut text and paste it back on paper upside down, sideways, at varying angles and so on: a collage concrete poem.

If you are trying to make an actual shape, you can have a grid of typed words over which you draw the outline of your required shape. When you cut this out, physically or digitally, the words inside will be trimmed exactly to the shape you have drawn.

Any of these 'cut and paste' concrete poems can then be screengrabbed/scanned and so on to make them appear more professional in their final presentation.
